



2025 BIRDATHON REPORT

May 2025

Dear Friend,

The 41st annual Northern Flint Hills Audubon Society Birdathon, April 26-27, was the effort of five teams who searched in an area generally centered on Manhattan. Our teams were very successful and found a total of 132 species, another new record. The next two pages, Spring 2025 Birdathon Report, shows those we found, the birders who reported their findings, and the local areas we all searched. We were blessed with seasonal weather and no muddy roads. The members of our five teams who reported their species to me are shown at the bottom of Page 2 of the Spring 2025 Birdathon Report. This 2-page report is my effort to continue the more than 20-year effort to show the species found. This year my Koelliker team, identified the 87 species shown by the **RED "5"** in the **'25 column**, and the 45 additional species not found by my team, but found by the other four teams are identified by the **RED "A."** The row for each species shows how often that species was found in the previous twenty years.

Unusual species found this year are shown on the fifth page, **Best Birds of 2025**. Only one new species, Blackpoll Warbler, was found for the first time, but you will see we were successful in finding quite a few others seldom found! Every year we miss several species that we expect to find. Our biggest misses are listed on that same page. I am thrilled with our results. I was hoping my team would exceed one hundred, BUT continuing this effort in now my eighth decade is getting more challenging. Many thanks to other teams for their assistance.

Pages 6 and 7 show the species found by each of the five NFHAS teams and the sixth team of KSU Bird Club members who helped out also.

I enjoy working on this Birdathon because I like the challenge and making this detailed report helps me be even more aware of our local birds. Too, I hope you find this report interesting & informative.

Yes, this report is a request for your financial support for the Northern Flint Hills Chapter of the Audubon Society. This effort is our primary fund-raising activity. Last year over forty contributors generously donated nearly \$3,000 that the chapter put to effective use to support our efforts in the area.

The 2025 total count was 132 species above the 20-year average, thanks to having five local parties scouring the area and cooperative weather.

TOTAL KOELLIKER TEAM EFFORT: Driving Miles: ~132, ~ 10 hours Walking Miles: ~1, ~2 hours Feeder Watching (HR): ~3

We searched in much of Manhattan, Tuttle Puddle, Pott #2 State Lake, south side of Konza, Geary Co State Lake and return drive below plus watching several feeders.

The other four parties contributed 45 additional species to the total results. Individuals included Patricia Yeager, Merry Bower, Scott Taylor, Jay Jeffrey, Jacque Staatz, Dick Oberst. In total we searched much of Riley and Pottawatomie Counties and some southern parts of Geary County.
