



2024 BIRDATHON REPORT

May 2024

Dear Friend,

The 40th annual Northern Flint Hills Audubon Society Birdathon, April 27-28, was the effort of five teams who searched in an area generally centered on Manhattan. Our teams were very successful and found a total of 129 species, a new record. The next two pages, Spring 2024 Birdathon Report shows those we found, the birders who reported their findings, and the local areas we all searched. Despite the very windy, stormy weather of the afternoon of the 27th, our results are amazing. The members of our five teams who reported their species to me are shown at the bottom of Page 2 of Spring 2024 Birdathon Report. This 2-page report is my effort to continue the more than 20-year effort to show the species found, 104 this year for my Koelliker team, identified by the **RED "4"** in the **'24 column**, and the 25 additional species not found by my team, but found by the other four teams are identified by the **RED "A."** The row for each species provides a way for you to see how often each species has been found in the previous twenty years.

Unusual species found this year are shown on the fourth page, **Best Birds of 2024**. Four species, Bewick's Wren, Kentucky Warbler, Short-Billed Dowitcher, and Canvasback Duck, were first-time finds in at least the past twenty years! The other four shown were also quite rare to be found. Every year we miss several species that we expect to find. Our biggest misses are listed on that same page. Considering the weather, chilly and generally windy, and other personal limitations, I am thrilled with our results. I was hoping to exceed one hundred. *PS: As I am preparing this, a painted bunting is at the feeder. We have not reported one for the past twenty years during the Birdathon!*

I always enjoy working on this Birdathon because I like the challenge and making this detailed report helps me be even more aware of our local birds. Too, I hope you find this report interesting & informative.

Yes, this report is a request for your financial support for the Northern Flint Hills Chapter of the Audubon Society. This effort is our primary fund-raising activity. Last year over forty contributors generously donated over \$3,000 that the chapter put to effective use to support our efforts in the area.

I am again asking for your support for my team and/or any of the others who made this effort a success by completing the form on the bottom of this page and sending it along with your check or cash to me, Jim Koelliker, at 3500 Mintons Lndg, Manhattan, KS 66503.

This year, too, our NFHAS helped the KSU Bird Club, avid student birders on campus, with some expenses to go birding at Cheyenne Bottoms and one of their members worked in Clay County and Upper Milford Reservoir area the same time as the Birdathon. While their efforts were outside the areas we have scoured over the forty years of the Birdathon, they reported their results to me. So, I included their findings in the comprehensive summary of all the species locally to show the breath of species you might expect to find in our wider areas and it is on the last two pages of this report. Their efforts increased the total species identified to 175! This total effort shows me the wonderful diversity of bird species that you might expect to find in the wider area of eastern Kansas in late April.

I hope you find this report interesting and useful.

I look forward to your support of this 40th Annual Birdathon!

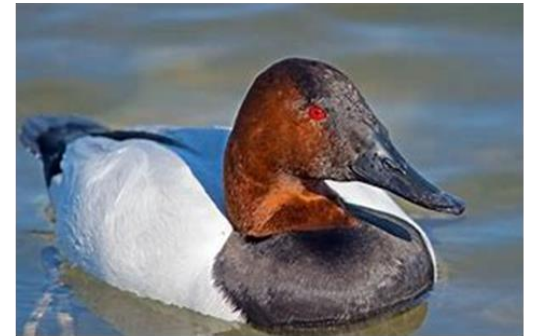

The KSU Bird Club had one report around Milford Lake and Clay County. Most the Club reported from birding to and from the Cheyenne Bottoms and Quiriva NWR areas.
